Current results as of today:

34 people have participated.

26 voted NO (76%)

8 voted YES (24%)

Here are some comments:

- 1) The township is getting money for the WHITE ELEPHANT. People talk about using the building for this or that, but where is the money coming for these programs and who is going to be responsible for the building
- 2) Yes, but only on a yearly basis. Let's collect the money to pay for a Community Education Director, someone who knows HOW to get programs started at the Rural Ridge site. Also, Adelphoi still has not given us the use of the computers, which was supposed to be one of the benefits to having them there
- 3) As far as I know, there have been no negative action by the students within the community. It is a great source of revenue for the township and the Brozek Center. Moving them to the new township building because of perceived negativity does not outway the positives. The new township building is going to be able to be used for many things, and as we are finding out, there is not a lot of interest in using the Brozek Center.
- 4) We need to set up a library in the community center.
- 5) We are concerned about the safety and the property value
- 6) The residents would like to use the center more during the day and it's difficult with them there so much

Thank you for participating. Please encourage others to voice their opinion as well. Adelphoi Village's lease is up in June and a decision will be made soon.

While we experienced certain positives with our relationship with AV over the last year, I believe it is time for AV to part ways from Rural Ridge. The school's presence became quite an issue in 2007, but we have continued to work through our differences, completed the interior renovation of the Brozek Center with monies obtained from the 1 year lease and still continue to forge ahead for the greater good of the community. As your elected official, if given the opportunity, I will vote "NO" to a renewed lease at the Brozek Center.

If a unanimous decision is obtained at a future board meeting on this issue, the decision will bring with it very specific consequences. We will need to replace this tenant ASAP with a library, senior programs or other classes that keep the Brozek Center from becoming a burden on all Indiana Township taxpayers. I am continuing to work with the Township:

- To find other new and exciting programs for the Brozek Center
- To recruit a Community Center Program Director (Dorseyville and Rural Ridge)
- To secure a library at the Brozek Center
- To fix the drainage issue on the Rural Ridge baseball field
- To install a new backstop
- Paint the entire fence around the field
- Repair and expand the pavilion
- Resurface the basketball court
- Replace the basketball hoops

These are just some of the projects on the docket for the next few years. I am hoping we can work together to continue the many successes within District #3.
