Re: 2009 Rural Ridge Update - New improvements and Vandalism arrests within our District.

Old Business:

Rich Hill Road - We will continue to do whatever it takes to make sure that the Harmar portion of this road is paved in 2009. We are doing our best to prevent an unnecessary death.

UPDATE - Harmar has applied for at least \$250k in grant money. They are to apply for an additional 200k as well. We will keep you posted. Their engineer, Larry Siler, said \$450 would do a "decent" repaving job on their portion of the road.

RR Sign: The new "Village of Rural Ridge Sign" is now erected. We are pleased to announce that we have received very nice feedback on the sign. Most like the new location as the sign welcomes all into our District.

Lauri Ann West -Request for Donation of Funds: Lauri Ann West is expecting well over 200k from Indiana Township for their new facility in Fox Chapel Borough. For this large sum, we may get some low level services at the Brozek Center. We have talked with several District #3 constituents and have a survey posted as well. We have overwhelming support to just say "no" on this issue. We cannot in good faith support this donation. We can open our own library or work with another library center and start up for far less than 200k. Lauri Ann West is clearly NOT looking out for us.

Rural Ridge Parklet -Planned Rural Ridge Parklet improvements - Projects to include, but not limited to; resurfacing of the basketball court, new fence for the back stop and along third base line including repainting the posts/supports. Route 910 Repair-Patrick Roberts with Penn DOT is scheduling a meeting to review the Route 910 reconstruction project from Route 28 to Saxonburg Boulevard to take place this summer. There will first be a meeting with Public Officials (Harmar and Indiana) who will meet at the Town Hall @ 5:30 pm Tuesday March 10th and then a public presentation at our BOS public meeting later that evening. They (Penn DOT) will advertise the public presentation including sending invitations to the affected residents and businesses along Route 910. Please join us at this important meeting.

Update - This is an 11 million dollar improvement project. We are VERY fortunate to get this project off the ground!!Our goal is to make this project seamless! We will to our best to keep all residents happy and monitor our contractors regularly. This is to be a major improvement for our township, not a burden to our residents.

Storm Damage - So many of our residents were impacted by the recent storms. Please call us with any damage/issues you might have experienced. We will help "put your stuff" back together.

Vandalism Continues at the Brozek Center - Vandals were out in full force over the holiday weekend. (2/14 - 2/16) and once again over the 3/7 - 3/8 weekend. Several windows in the Center

were shot out. Most likely with a pellet and/or BB gun. Police Patrols have been added. We need your help.

****If you see suspicious people hanging around the building during the day or evening, please call 911 and have the police stop by. We cannot afford these useless damages. Insurance claims lead to higher premiums.

UPDATE: Our police have arrested 6 individuals for burglary and vandalism at the Brozek Center. 2 adults and 4 juveniles. More arrests may occur.

Our police have also arrested 3 juveniles for vandalism in the new construction area of Shawnee Ridge.

Drilling along the Indiana Township portion of Rich Hill Road - Drilling continues and a few minor problems have occurred. We have asked all companies to comply with all agreements regarding "begin drilling" and "stop drilling" times. Companies can drill from 7am - 9 pm. Both the Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) and the police have been notified of these times. The CEO will cite the drilling company for noncompliance.
