

Mr. Krally:

The bridge in question is owned by the County and it has been determined that the bridge needs to be repaired. It is a joint project with PennDot.

As you know, the road is owned by Indiana and Harmar townships. We cannot force the township to apply for the loans that would assist in paying for the road repairs. I am not sure what you are referring to in regards to a study. You contacted our office and asked us to look into the condition of the road. We sent a staff member, Joe Klak, to take a look at the road. He agreed that it needs work, but again, it is not a county road and we cannot force Harmar to apply for the loan to assist with its repairs.

If you have additional specific questions regarding the bridge repair, I am happy to connect you with our Public Works Director, Joe Olczak.
